Message Reflections accompany the weekly message.

The Lord always commands habits that are good for our souls and our physical bodies. I love when science catches up to Him with a new study showing scientific evidence proving something is good for us when it has been in the Bible for thousands of years: taking care of animals lowers blood pressure; marriage improves our health and our reported happiness; married couples report higher levels of sexual satisfaction than dating couples; thankfulness lowers your risk for depression; people who serve others live longer, have less anxiety and depression, and report high levels of content. Fascinating!

In this sermon series, we are talking about God's command to sing. That's right...command. For some of us, this is the sermon we have been waiting for our whole lives!
